You may recall our country has 737 per 100,000 people incarcerated, which is six times more than the worldwide midpoint of 145 per 100,000 people. Our prison population was relatively flat until the 1980's. Due primarily to the war on drugs, our incarceration population had increased by an astonishing 500% in the last 30 years. 49% of
